## Glamour & Grit

This exhibit features vehicles and artifacts from the 1920s and 1930s, showing how cars transformed work and wealth. From luxurious models symbolizing status to mass-produced cars reshaping daily life, the exhibit demonstrates how cars became central to social identity and economic progress, symbolizing both freedom and affluence.

## Muscle Car Gallery

This gallery showcases some of the most sought after muscle cars from the 60s and 70s.

## Franklin Collection

The H.H. Franklin Club has preserved the legacy of America's most successful air-cooled vehicle within the recreation of a circa 1916 dealership.

## Model A Ford Museum

A recreated 1928 Ford Dealership, complete with gas pumps and a service bay to tell the story of Henry Ford's fantastic Model A.

## Cadillac-LaSalle Club Museum

The Cadillac-LaSalle Club was founded in 1958 and now celebrates the traditions of excellence in this beautifully recreated 1948 Cadillac-LaSalle Dealership.

## Lincoln Motorcar Heritage Museum

The LMCH Foundation established this museum. The building itself is a replica of the P.J. Platte dealership featured in the Lincoln Service Bulletin, January 1926.

## Museum of the Horseless Carriage

This exhibit features the cars that started it all - Pioneer Era Cars.

## Campania Barn

Built in 1897, the barn was moved more than 45 miles and reassembled board by board on site in 1966. Today it features vehicles of the 1920s to 1940s.

## Pierce-Arrow Museum

Established by the Pierce-Arrow Society, this museum features an exceptional presentation of some of the finest American luxury cars.

## Classic Car Club of America Museum

Don't miss this collection of unforgettable Full Classics® and one of the world's largest displays of automotive mascots.

## Shell Station

This recreated 1930s gas station features a full-service work bay and gas pumps where gas is always 18 cents a gallon!

## Train Depot

This old-time train depot was built on-site in 1966 and now houses restrooms for guests.

## Train Switch Tower

This tower served the Kalamazoo and South Haven Railroad for nearly 100 years before it was moved in 1964 to the museum campus and restored.

## Motorcycle Gallery

This is a remarkable array of vintage motorcycles spanning 100 years of history.

## Model T Garage, Tunnel & Driving Experience

All-operational Model T fleet features cars from 1908-1927. Henry Ford was the man behind the Model T. Due to mass affordability, over 15 million units were sold. *Open select days.*

## Red Barns Raceway (slot cars)

The first slot car track in the USA was right here in Kalamazoo in 1955. Our state-of-the-art slot car track is *open on select days.*

## Carriage House

Constructed in 1963, this was Donald Gilmore's first display gallery. Inside you'll also find an exact replica of the Wright Bros Wright Flyer. Experience the Gnome-Mobile, used in the filming of Disney's 1967 feature film. This larger than life movie set and car were personal gifts to Museum founder Donald S. Gilmore from Walt Disney himself.

## Blue Moon Diner

In 2004 this 1941 diner was moved over 700 miles from Meriden, CT to the Museum. Now, guests can visit for lunch and delicious sweet treats!


